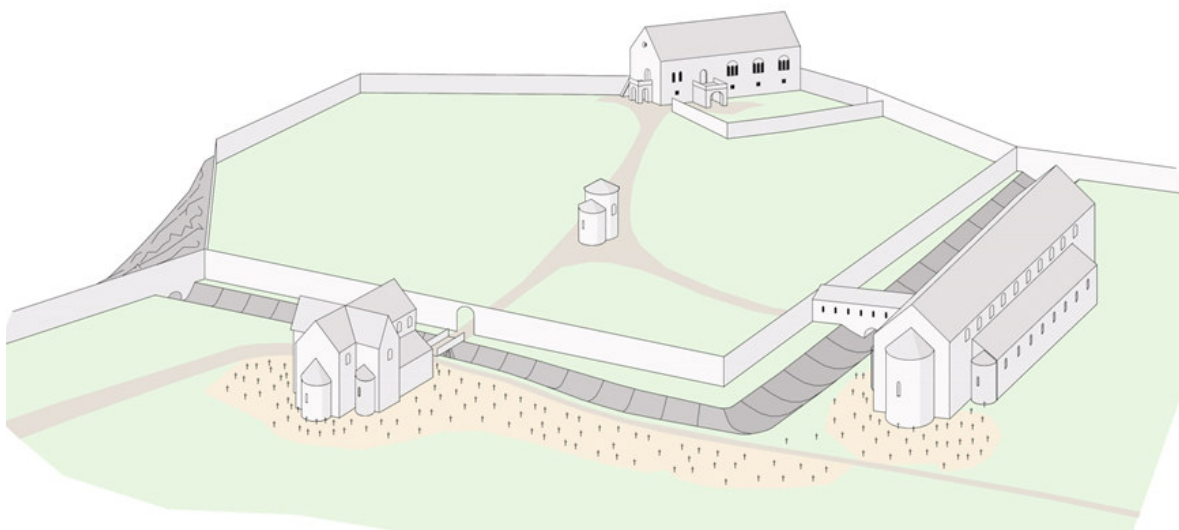

Vratislaus II. of Bohemia (1061–1092) and his royal program at Vysehrad (Czech Republic)

Historical sources indicate that the first Czech king Vratislaus II. (crowned 1085/1086) tried to modify domestic political organization and that for place of his innovative political program he chose Vysehrad-hillfort (part of today's Prague). In the presentation we will try to learn which particular steps he undertook in the field of material culture and architecture. We will ask why for short period of time Vysehrad reached almost the same position as prominent Czech centre at Prague Castle and why the Vratislaus' project failed soon after his death. Our conclusions will be based on recent archaeological and art-historian findings which on the present seem to constitute arch stones integrating generally known but patchy pieces of written evidence and traditions.
